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Welcome to A&P! Course Overview: **Anatomy** is the study of the structure of body parts – their forms and how they are organized. **Physiology** is the study of the function of body parts – what they do and how they do it. A strong emphasis will be placed on learning new terminology, assimilating information, and making claims backed by evidence and reasoning. This course will cover 13 units including all major body systems: *Organization & Homeostasis, Histology, Integumentary, Skeletal, Muscular, Senses & Nervous, Respiratory, Cardiovascular, Lymphatic, Urinary, Digestive, Endocrine, Reproductive, Growth & Development.*

General Class Rule: Always be prepared for class and be respectful of yourself, your classmates, and your teachers.

Grading

- 40% Daily Grades – Warm-Ups, Concept Checks, Assignments, Quizzes, Minor Labs
- 60% Major Grades – Major Labs, Major Projects, Unit Tests

Absences and Late Work

- If you are absent for a lesson, it is your responsibility to check the Class Calendar and Google Classroom to see what you missed. All late work (excluding late submissions due to excused absences), will be deducted **15 points per day.**
- If an assignment is due on the date that you are absent, and the absence is excused, then the assignment is due at the beginning of class on the day that you return to school.
- If you are absent on the date that the assignment is assigned, it is your responsibility to check the Class Calendar and Google Classroom to see what you missed. If the absence is excused, you have as many days as you were absent to make up the assignment. **If the absence is unexcused the day that the assignment was assigned, the assignment is due on the original due date.**
- Policies for late work and absences *may* change depending on the circumstances.

Test and Quiz Make-ups

- Students who miss a scheduled test or quiz will be expected to make up the assessment on the next Tuesday, Thursday, or Friday in compliance with the [Science Department Make-up Policy](#). Students who are absent may be given a make-up test version.
- **Absences on test and quiz days must be excused and will be tracked.** If a consistent pattern of absences on test and quiz days are found, it will be necessary to have a meeting including parents, teacher, and administration.

Dissection

We will have several hands-on dissections that will be done throughout the year. ***Students must have a signed dissection letter on file at least 30 days prior to the start of dissection labs.*** Inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated during dissections. No phones will be allowed during dissection days. If you are doing anything not specified in the lab procedure, then you may be removed at any time from a dissection and given a zero for the lab grade. You are required to wear gloves and goggles the entire time you are in the classroom on dissection days. Gloves & goggles will be provided, but you may bring your own if you choose.
