What is a Collegiate Academy?

- Pathway for students to earn high school credits simultaneously with college credits
 - ~ 62 hours / 2 years of college credit
- Students earn high school diploma and Associate degree (2 graduations)
- Instruction provided by college credentialed faculty
- Bridge between high school and college

Program Overview

- Partnership between Plano ISD & Collin College
- Provides a pathway for Plano ISD students to earn an Associate's Degree while in HS
 - Associate of Arts
 - Associate of Science
- Located in the Wildcat Nation Feeder Pattern
 - Vines High School for grades 9 and 10
 - Plano Senior High School for grades 11 and 12
- College curriculum provided within a high school structure of a "school within a school"

Criteria for Admission



Open to current 8th graders & limited seats for current 9th grade students



At the "Meets" level on Fall 8th Grade MAP Reading Assessment



Have 90% attendance rate (no more than 6 full or partial day absences by application date)



Students must take and pass the reading and writing portions of the TSI-Assessment to enroll in college courses



Students must be college ready in math by or before senior year



Students will work closely with the Collegiate Academy counselor to meet their individual needs to participate in programs like Band, Athletics, Fine Arts and AVID.



Lottery Process

- Review for program criteria:
 - Attendance 90% rate
 - "Meets" level on Fall Reading MAP assessment
- Reserve 40% for economically disadvantaged students
- Random lottery conducted at district office



1 on 1 Student Meetings

- After random lottery selection, students will be scheduled for a mandatory 1-1 meeting with WCA staff members.
- The purpose of the meeting is to ensure that the student is committed to the WCA program and all of the factors it entails.
- It is also an opportunity for us to get to know the student and for the student to advocate for their needs.
